About the College

Swami Vivekananda Mahavidyalaya, Government Degree College, is located on the Agartala-Shimna Road in the Mohanpur Sub-division under the West Tripura district. It is the only general degree college in the entire Mohanpur sub division with a population of approximately 1.5 lakhs. The college is just 17 K.Ms. away from the capital city, Agartala. The college campus is spread on 24.4 acres of land.

As a part of celebration of 150th Birth Anniversary of great Indian Philosopher, Swami Vivekananda, The Government of Tripura named the College after Swami Vivekananda. It was inaugurated on 4th August 2012 by the Chief Minister of the State, Sri Manik Sarkar. The college has an administrative block and an academic block. The college is affiliated to Tripura University. It began its academic works with introduction of general subjects like-English, Bengali, Political Science, History and Education & Kokborok was added later. In Aug-2014 Bio-Science (Botany, Human Physiology & Zoology) and in 2020 commerce also introduced. Later on Honours was introduced in the three subjects in Botany, Human Physiology and Zoology in 2017. At present Honours/Major is offered in 5 subjects viz. Bengali, Political Science, History, Education and English. The Government of Tripura has vision for gradual expansion of college.

About the Webinar

India and China are the two most ancient civilizations of the world having solid relations until the second half of the 20th century. Their relationship can be traced back to around 2000 B.C. Buddhism arrived to China from India in 65 A.D. Reflection of history also gives us a vivid account of Chinese scholars visiting India to learn Buddhism like Fa-Hien, Huen-Tsang and Yi-Tsing. Likewise many Indians scholars especially from Kashmir also visited China leading to the development of people to people contact. These contacts were further strengthened by the anti-colonial nationalist movement both the countries fought. It is also in record that the father of modern China Sun Yat Sen had maintained close contacts with Indian revolutionaries such as Ras Bihari Bose, M. N. Roy and others. This relation didn't stop there.

India and China are poised to develop their relationship beyond the bilateral framework for the simple reason of their multilateral engagements in RIC (Russia-India-China) SCO (Shanghai Cooperation Organization) BRICS (Brazil-Russia-India-China and South Africa).

The testing times of India-China relations started in the midst of the Corona outbreak worldwide with China's increasing expansionist attitude towards its neighbours particularly with India in Ladakh sectors requiring unprecedented reaction and measures from Indian side. This has ruined the constructive dialogues carried out through the 1980s and 1990s to put back the 1962 border war and establish greater economic cooperation but the recent standoff initiated by China and its strategic design to play India's neighbours against New Delhi has prompted India to look for tough actions and exceptional measures to deal with the Chinese mindset. The situation between the two neighbours as of now is bleak and shows no signs of normalization at least in near future.
